## **Truro Celebrates the Coronation**

Truro is preparing a line-up of events to celebrate the Coronation of Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

The national celebrations will take place across the bank holiday weekend from Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> – Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May.

Truro City Council is again working with Truro Cathedral to live screen the Coronation in the Cathedral as well as Truro Farmers Market, who are organising a celebratory market event on Lemon Quay.

The Mayor of Truro, Cllr Steven Webb, said: “As one of my final roles as Mayor of Truro, I am looking forward to taking part in the parade and welcoming you all to the Civic Service.

“It has been brilliant to once again work with the team at Truro Cathedral to enable the community to come together to celebrate this historic occasion.”

### **Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May: Live screening of the Coronation at Truro Cathedral**

Whilst we are awaiting confirmation of a time, we can confirm that the Coronation service will be livestreamed in Truro Cathedral. It is free to attend, and seats will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis on the day.

Truro Cathedral will also host children’s activities on the day, with more details to follow shortly.

### **Truro Farmers Market Street Party**

The farmers market will adopt a street-party theme and will be on Lemon Quay from 09.00 - 16.00. The green and white striped tents will line the Quay, with a vast selection of Cornish produce and craft.

There will also be the addition of live music, a traditional tombola and they will be offering free cream teas to all visitors from midday until they run out !

## **Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May**

### **Bandstand Concert & Garden Games at Victoria Gardens**

The summer bandstand concerts will commence for the 2023 season on the Coronation weekend, with a performance by Indian Queens Band to start this year's series.

The concert will take place in Victoria Gardens between 14.30 and 16.00 and is free to attend.

Garden games will also be laid on the lawn in the gardens for all to use.

### **Lord Lieutenant's Parade and Civic Service**

On Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May, there will be a Parade through the city centre, followed by the Civic Service in Truro Cathedral.

At 16.30, the parade will step off from Lemon Quay, led by the Kernow Pipes and Drums. The Lord Lieutenant of Cornwall Col Edward Bolitho, the Rt Rev Philip Mounstephen, Bishop of Truro, Interim Dean Simon Robinson, and Mayor of Truro Cllr Steven Webb, will be at the front of the parade as well as the Royal British Legion Cornwall and Truro branches .

The procession will culminate on High Cross before the start of the Civic Service.

The service will feature the cathedral choir, which will include the girl choristers who have been invited to sing at the Coronation service in Westminster Abbey on the day before.

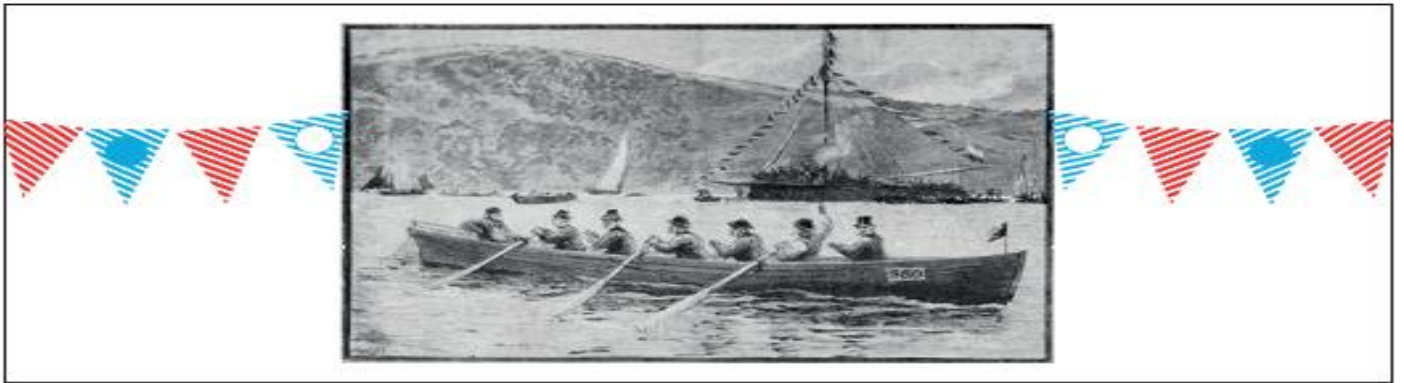

## 1856 Regatta Revival

Saturday 20th May 2023 4pm, at Devoran Quay

Some years ago the late Ralph Bird, Boatbuilder, who lived and worked at Carnon Mine, researched a regatta called the Devoran, Point & Perranwharf Regatta, held in 1856. It was his wish to recreate this event, (as much as possible allowing for silting of the river), and he left a hand drawn map and written details of how the racing was held, see below.

In Ralph's honour, and to honour the history of boat building, and racing in our villages, Devoran Pilot Gig Club are holding a Victorian regatta for 6-oared gigs, 4-oared gigs and skiffs to be held on Saturday 20th May 2023 at 4pm.

For racing this is to be an invitation only event due to the length of race and safety of numbers, however we hope the village communities will join in and watch from vantage points from Devoran Quay to Point Quay and enjoy some entertainment and refreshments.

*The regatta will be Victorian themed, and period dress will be encouraged.*

**Devoran, Point, and Perran Wharf Regatta**  
WILL take place on Monday, September 1st, 1856, when the following PRIZES will be contended for by:

**PANAVAN BOATS**, not exceeding 16 feet in length—1st prize, a Silver Cup; 2nd prize, a Silver Cap.

**SIXTEEN POETS**, not exceeding 14 feet in length—1st prize, £1 10s.; 2nd prize, £1; 3rd prize, 10s.

**N.B.**—No punt with false-keel, grips, or washstrake will be allowed to contend for these prizes.

**FOUR-OARED GIGS**, not exceeding 25 feet in length, to be rowed by Amateurs—1st prize, £1 10s.; 2nd prize, £1; 3rd prize, 10s.

**PUNTS**, not exceeding 15 feet in length, to be pulled by three men with two oars and two paddles—1st prize, £1 10s.; 2nd prize, £1; 3rd prize, 10s.

**SKIFFS**—1st prize, £2; 2nd prize, £1 10s.; 3rd prize, £1; 4th prize, 10s.

**LINCOLNS**, to be sailed, pulled, or rowed, three men only being allowed on board while racing, time race—1st prize, £1 10s.; 2nd prize, £1; 3rd prize, 10s.

**PANAVAN**, to be pulled by one crew with two paddles—1st prize, 10s.; 2nd prize, 10s.; 3rd prize, 6s.

Accordingly. The committee, considering the circumstances, awarded the crew of the *staves* ten shillings.

The races which next followed, were rowing matches, and all started from the moorings at Devoran. The course for the gigs and rowing boats was:—From the moorings at Devoran round the boat in Pezayn creek, thence back past a boat opposite Narabo Wharf, (leaving it on the larboard hand) through the Gap to Perran Wharf Channel, round a boat in Perran Wharf creek, thence back round the boat at Devoran, opposite the Sluice,—(passing each time on the east side of the Pole at the Gap leading to Perran Wharf Channel), and to the starting boat—leaving all other marks on the starboard hand.

The length of the course is about 4½ miles, and a better and prettier course for rowing matches, could not be selected. From the terrace, and greater number of houses in Devoran, the races could be seen nearly throughout the whole course.

The first race was between three four-oared gigs, rowed by amateurs, all from Truro, and a very good race came off; two prizes only were awarded, as three gigs only started. The first boat, the *Maid of the Mill*, won easily; but the second gig, the *Westerhill*, was of a heavier description, which, of course, made some difference in the chance of winning. The crews of both the winning gigs looked far more like professionals than amateurs, and showed in strong contrast to the crew of the *Treazor*, who were no match for their more muscular competitors. The crew of the *Treazor* rowed well, and but for an accident depriving them of the best rower (Mr. Sharpe), would no doubt have obtained a much better position.

The next race was for four prizes for ships' boats, and was a most exciting and spirited contest; in fact, it was the race
