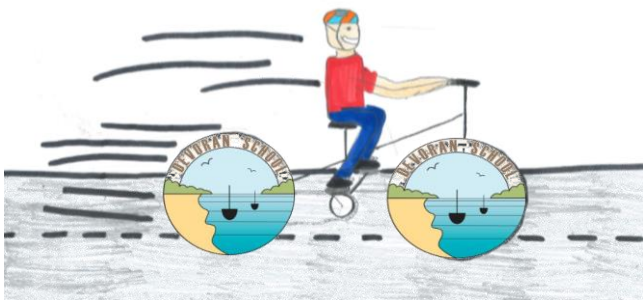


Peter's Bike Ride – 72 miles for his 72nd year!

News

We had an incredibly busy first week back at wraparound. The children have enjoyed being outside making the most of the weather and have settled back into routine really well.

This week we will be inviting those children that would like to the opportunity to design and send a card to King Charles III for this coronation. Any children who do not attend Wraparound but would like to send a card or picture are invited to drop them off either to Breakfast or After School club no later than the morning of Friday 28th so we can get them in the post that day.

We will also be getting ready to Celebrate 30 days wild in May and spending as much time outside as possible.

Booking Wraparound Sessions

Each week the number of children we have attended who are not booked in either via ParentPay or email is increasing rapidly. **This week alone we had 58 children attend sessions that had not been booked.** Which does not include sessions where parents have called or emailed during the day to add children into club.

With this in mind we would like to kindly remind everyone of the need to book sessions either on ParentPay, Class Dojo or by emailing emmafoden@devoranschool.co.uk remembering that ParentPay bookings close at midnight each day.

If you have any difficulties booking on ParentPay please contact me and let me know and I can make the booking for you. This means we can ensure the safe arrival and collection of the children.

I will repost the how to book video on Dojo this week as a refresher. Please ensure when booking you select the specific date and session to your booking rather than just adding money to the account or we do not know to expect the children.

If your child/ren will be attending a club before an afternoon Wraparound session please book as follows.

4-15pm-5:15pm book the AF1 slot on ParentPay

4:15pm-6pm book the AF2 slot on ParentPay

Being prepared whatever the weather

As the weather improves can we ask that the children come in prepared to spend time outside. Named hats, water bottles and sun cream are all a necessity, along with raincoats in case of showers.

If you would rather not take them home each day hats and sun cream can be left within club as long as they are named. Please feel free to drop them to a member of staff at any point.

Term Dates Consultation 2024-2025

Cornwall Council is responsible for setting the term dates for maintained Community and Voluntary Controlled schools in Cornwall. Other types of school, including Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust and Academy schools, are able to set their own term dates but are encouraged to use the same dates in order to promote consistency across the county.

Draft term dates

The proposed term dates are set in accordance with a three-term year model, with the main breaks taking place at Christmas, Easter and Summer. This is a long-established and accepted model in Cornwall and used in the vast majority of schools across the country.

Maintained schools are required to offer 190 days (380 half-day sessions) of education to pupils. The academic year includes 195 days, with the additional five days being allotted for in-service training (INSET). Academies do not have to follow this requirement but most will follow a very similar pattern.

The proposed dates are produced in consultation with Plymouth and Devon local authorities in order to prevent inconvenience to families and schools living and working close to or across local authority boundaries. The proposed dates for 2024/25 offer good consistency with those set by Plymouth and Devon Councils. Neither Plymouth nor Devon councils have yet set their dates for 2024/25.

Following the close of the consultation period all feedback received will be reviewed and a final decision on the term dates will be made by the Cabinet Member for Children and Families.
