Parent and Baby Needed!

In our continued efforts to support children with their social and emotional development, last term Mrs Covey has attended some training called B.A.S.E. Babywatching. B.A.S.E. stands for **B**abywatching to reduce **A**nxiety and **A**ggression and promote **S**ensitivity and **E**mpathy

What is it?

A parent, and their baby, visit a class of children, once a week, for half an hour, so the children can watch the interactions between parent and baby, and their developing relationship. Guided by the Group Leader, this simple act of detailed observation reduces children's anxiety and aggression by increasing understanding and empathy. Children feel safer, more focused and 'ready to learn'.

The Children's Commissioner's The Big Ask...and The Big Answer

Earlier this year our children at Devoran School took part in 'The Big Ask'. The Children's Commissioner asked all children in England to complete a survey, to show the true voice of this generation. The results are in and The Children's Commissioner would like to say thank you. Over half a million children responded, the largest survey of its kind in history, and at a landmark moment for young people growing up in this country.

At a critical time, as we emerge from the pandemic, children have told us how the past year has affected them and what needs to happen now to put them at the heart of the recovery. Despite the sacrifices they have made, the majority of children say they are happy.

Children were united – they told us they want to get back to school, to get on, and do well. To have fulfilling lives. Children cared deeply about their family, their communities, their wellbeing and are an ambitious, excited generation. They want to contribute to a better world, a greener world, rooted in fairness of opportunity for everyone. The Children's Commissioner is now making sure children are being heard.

If you do not apply on time for your preferred school/s, they may already be full. Please check your eligibility for **Home to School Transport** before naming preferences.

Getting to the nitty gritty

Making the most of the comb.

Make sure you comb the hair thoroughly using the right technique. Here are some tips to help you.

1. Wash the hair with ordinary shampoo and apply plenty of conditioner.

 Yes! The hair has to be wet. Dry lice will scurry away from the disturbance of the comb but they remain still when they are wet; giving you a better chance of catching them all in the teeth of the comb.

3. Use an ordinary, wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair.

4. Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the head lice comb.

5. Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots, with the edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp.

6. Draw the comb down from the roots to the ends of the hair with every stroke, and check the comb for lice each time – remove lice by wiping the comb with tissue paper or rinsing it.

7. Work through the hair, section by

section, so that the whole head of hair is combed through.

8. Do this at least twice to help ensure you haven't missed any areas, until no more lice are found.

9. Repeat the process five days

later just to be sure. 10.Scan the QR code to watch a video from NHS choices (or search NHS Choices head lice video online).
