Dear Parents and Carers










Year Six

In Year 6 Art, children have been learning to explore how artists embrace aspects of their experience of life — using their background, culture, race, gender, and interests to inform and shape their artwork. It was inspired by the artist, Mike Barrett, to enable a physical (using drawing materials, paper, collage), or digital exploration of how to make a layered portrait that captures aspects of their personality and identity. The children loved layering and using mixed media to create this collage of themselves. They then used digital software to edit and add text and filters to their designs. They chose a final design for the display and evaluated it.

Careful Driving


