Dear Parents and Carers



Anti-bullying Ambassador Box



Location: Outside the school office, by the main entrance.

What is it for? The box is to be used for any worries you might have. You can also write questions, ask for advice or offer suggestions to the Ambassadors.

When will it be opened? The box will be opened and checked by the Ambassadors, with a trusted adult, every Thursday. We may discuss your note further with you if we need to.

Do not forget: if you add a note to the box, it must include your full name and your year on the piece of paper.

If your note is urgent and if you need help before Thursday, you should talk to a trusted adult or an Anti-bullying Ambassador, who will be able to help you sooner.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

Your child is invited to sign up for this year's <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u>. Sign up at your local library!

What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays – and to enjoy anything they like to read! Children aged 4-11 are invited to set a reading goal, and collect rewards for their reading.

It's FREE to take part, and last year 75% of children taking part improved their reading skills over the holidays.¹

Why should my child sign up?

- They will be **better prepared to return to school** in the autumn.
- The Challenge supports the move into a new year group.
- Becoming more independent in their reading boosts children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The library provides **free access** to books and fun family activities all through the summer.
- Library staff are on hand to offer support and book recommendations.

Your child will be part of a UK-wide programme developed by <u>The Reading Agency</u> and delivered in partnership with the <u>public library network</u>.

How can my child take part? (Library OR online)

In the library. Visit your local library and sign up. Your child will:

- Set a reading goal for the summer and borrow and read books, eBooks and audiobooks. Your child can choose anything they like to read!
- Receive a Challenge folder and collect special stickers and rewards for reading.

<u>OR</u>

Online. Take part online at <u>summerreadingchallenge.org.uk</u>

- Sign up on the <u>official Challenge website</u>.
- Set a reading goal and get tips for accessing books for free at home.
- Unlock digital badges and online rewards, including a printable certificate.

When?

Throughout the **summer holidays.** Check with your local library to find out start & finish dates near you. Unsure where your closest library is? Use the <u>Library Finder</u> to check.

If you have any difficulties booking on ParentPay please contact me and let me know and I can make the booking for you. This means we can ensure the safe arrival and collection of the children. Please ensure when booking that you select the <u>specific date and</u> <u>session</u> to your booking rather than just adding money to the account or we do not know to expect the children.
